What is ASA ?

- ASA is the « Action Spécifique ALMA »
- CNRS/INSU initiative to promote the use of ALMA and (mm interferometry in general) in the French astronomy community
- Created in 2005 (M. Gérin et A. Dutrey), an renewed in 2008 (J. Pety) and 2013 (S. Maret)

« Contribute to the scientific program of the Plateau de Bure Interferometer and NOEMA »

« Develop and support Herschel and Planck follow-up observation programs with ALMA »
